
Science

Forces and Magnets:

- Compare how objects move on different surfaces.
- Notice that some forces need contact between two objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance.
- Discover which materials are magnetic.
- Examine if all magnets are the same strength and whether they attract one another.

In Number we are:

- developing mental and written calculation strategies for addition and subtraction
- learning number facts
- discovering what we mean by area, using different strategies to calculate this and ways we can compare areas.
- grouping and sharing as a method for multiplication and division
- working on our times tables skills and using these within our work
